2009-2010 Governor's Interclub Contest

WHAT IS AN INTERCLUB AND WHO CAN WE VISIT ?

When a specified number of members of a Kiwanis club visit another Kiwanis club or Service Leadership club at a regular meeting or any other organized Kiwanis Family function, it qualifies as an interclub. The number of members needed for an interclub is dependent upon the size of your club. You are encouraged to visit your sponsored Service Leadership clubs and observe their activities and participate in them, if possible. This includes Key Club, Circle K, Aktion Club, Builders Club, and K-Kids. District Governor Mike Grimes hopes every club will interclub with every other Kiwanis club in their division during the contest which runs from October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010.

RULES FOR EARNING POINTS THIS CONTEST PERIOD ARE:

- The rules for the number of members for an interclub are based on the number of members in your club as of October 1, 2009 — 20 members or less (Coral) need only two — 21-30 members (Emerald) need only three — and 31 members or more (Ruby and Diamond) need four.
- An interclub to a club in your division **10 points**
- An interclub to a club out of your division **15 points**.

- An interclub attending Mid-Winter Conference (February) **25 points** (no mileage points)
- Mo-Ark District Convention (August) **25 points** (no mileage points)
- An interclub attending International Convention in Las Vegas (June 2010) **50 points** (no mileage points)
- A bonus of **10 times** the number of clubs in your division is earned if ALL clubs in your division are interclubbed with during the contest period.
- Points for miles driven the most direct route) ONE WAY to make an interclub visit will be computed as follows:
 - 1 to 74 miles - **5 points**
 - 75 to 100 miles - **10 points**
 - 100 to 125 miles - **15 points**
 - Over 125 miles - **20 points**
- An additional 100 bonus points will be given if your club interclubs with every club in a division other than your own. **100 points**
- An additional 100 bonus points will be given if everyone in your club attends at least one interclub. **100 points**

A BANNER PATCH will be awarded to each club visiting ALL clubs in their division.

A BANNER PATCH OR PLAQUE will be awarded to the club with the most points in each size category, provided they have interclubbed with all clubs in their division.

SIZE CATEGORY RULES are based on number of members in your club on October 1, 2009, as follows:

Coral: Less than 20 members

Emerald: 21 through 30 members

Ruby: 31 through 75 members

Diamond: 76 members or more

EACH CLUB'S INTERCLUB CHAIRMAN is asked to keep an accurate record of the club's activity based on the above rules and submit a detailed report to the District Chair by October 15, 2010. It *should* contain the following information:

- *Your club name and location;*
- *size category and division number;*
- *the date and number of your club members making each interclub;*

- *the name, location, and division number of each club with which you interclubbed;*
- *miles ONE WAY and number of points earned for each interclub.*

Include the number of points earned for interclubbing with ALL clubs in your division and points earned for attending Mid-Winter Conference, International Convention, District Convention, and any other bonus points.
