Remember to fill out the forms completely (two pages) and mail them to Cheryl Anderson (Missouri) or Tom Wiles (Arkansas). The addresses are at the bottom of the last page. *Mail the forms by July 1, 2010.* Please note that this is earlier than last year. More time is needed to review and grade the entries.

Outstanding Project Award

The banner patch award program is designed to recognize exemplary projects that address the needs of children, prenatal through age five. The purpose of the program is to encourage all clubs to develop ambitious projects. The nominator must feel that the project merits recognition. A club may complete this form and submit it to the district chairman.

A special banner patch will be awarded to the club submitting the winning project in each of these club size divisions:

- ❖ Coral division (20 members or less) (Missouri winner and Arkansas winner)
- ❖ Emerald division (21 through 30 members) (Missouri winner and Arkansas winner)
- ❖ Ruby division (31 through 75 members) (Missouri winner and Arkansas winner)
- ❖ Diamond division (76 or more members) (Missouri winner and Arkansas winner)

Submitted projects will be evaluated and a winner determined by a committee in each state. Winners will be announced at the Young Children: Priority One breakfast at the District Convention in Jefferson City.

All clubs submitting a project will receive a banner patch with a pin designating the year.
